President Schoch called the meeting to order at 7:03pm.

Minutes - Randy Schoch

A motion to approve the minutes from the December board meeting was made and seconded. Minutes were approved.

Annual Meeting

The board discussed the annual meeting, required by the club constitution to be held in March. Everyone agreed that last year's annual meeting was successful, and it was suggested that we follow last year's format of having a potluck dinner. The board suggested March 23rd, with March 16th as a backup. Jane Hudnall offered to check the availability of Grace Lutheran Church. The board agreed that, as in the past, a donation to Grace Lutheran would be appropriate if we are able to use its facility.

The meeting agenda will include election of officers, as required. Other agenda items are to be decided.

Indian Head 100 Planning – Jessica Hirschhorn

Jessica led the discussion of planning for the IH 100. She noted that the last time the century was held, in 2019, there were approximately 1000 riders, 85 volunteers, and 5 rest stops with one rest stop run by club members and the others by outside groups with club member assistance. Jessica and Joan had sent a lengthy memo that described the concept of dividing the event into 12 (or more as needed) tasks, with one board member or other member managing each task. The board approved that concept.

Jessica discussed each role and board members and others volunteered to manage the various roles, as noted below:

- Registration: Leslie Tierstein
- Parking: Ellen Goodwin. Randy Schoch offered to contact the Indian Head management and confirm that parking for 500 cars is ok.
- SAG: Unassigned
- Routes and Road Marking/Signage: Steve Palincsar and Sherwood Byers
- Website for Event: Joan with Jim Hudnall's help.
- Rest Stops (Durham Church, Oak Grove, St. Ignatius, Thomas Stone, Smallwood): Jessica noted that 2 people need to oversee the rest stops. Diane Harris and Joan volunteered to oversee rest stops. Jessica will manage Smallwood.
- Picnic: Dan and Diane Donahue

- Communication with Registrants: Joan Oppel and Steve Palincsar
- Communication with Officials: Joan Oppel with Jim and Jane Hudnall.
- Porta-Potties: Dan and Diana Donahue
- Supply Coordination: Unassigned
- Promotion: Jessica Hirschhorn
- Payment on Wild Apricot: Jim Hudnall
- Communication with Insurance: Joan Oppel

The board discussed next steps. A meeting will be held on February 5 to discuss the event. The board also discussed the number of club member volunteers needed to run the IH100. As noted, 85 were involved in the 2019 event. The board discussed sending an email to past IH100 volunteers and all club members stating that we are considering running the IH 100 but need to know whether folks are willing to volunteer.

The Rural Legacy was brought up. board members discussed whether we could run both the Rural Legacy and Indian Head events as full. Board members discussed deciding whether the IH 100 was definite in the next month or so.

The meeting adjourned at 8:09pm.

The IH100 Planning Committee will meet on February 5 at 7pm. The next Oxon Hill Board meeting will be on February 12 at 7 pm.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:51pm.

Ride with GPS Club Account Route Library Half-a-Road Captain's Report – by Steve Palincsar

One of the benefits of membership in the Oxon Hill Bicycle and Trail Club is membership in our Ride With GPS club account. Taking the place of the old route library of cue sheets, our club account route library lets you find and download routes onto your smartphone or GPS-bike computer with only a free Ride with GPS membership. Membership in the club account provides premium navigation features on all club routes and events:

- Voice Navigation in the RWGPS mobile app
- Offline Maps in the RWGPS mobile app
- PDF Maps + Cuesheets
- Advanced Turn Notifications with TCX files
- Estimated time

Using the RWGPS smartphone app gives access to turn-by-turn voice navigation for routes in the club library.

Only active OHBike members may access our club account. You must also have a RWGPS account. You do not need a paid account; a *free* account works fine. If you don't already have a RWGPS account, create one.

Joining the OHBike club account:

- Create a RWGPS account. Remember, the free account is all you need: https://ridewithgps.com/signup
- Once your account is created, click this link to join the club account: https://ridewithgps.com/auto_approve/Club/298/zQj36hVybNl23Lq2
- 3. Then click **Continue to club** to get to the club's home page within RWGPS.

Accessing the Club Routes Once You are a Member

If you exit from RWGPS and want to view the club routes, login using the user name and password you created. The dashboard at the left of the screen will display the Oxon Hill logo. Click on that to view the RWGPS club home page.

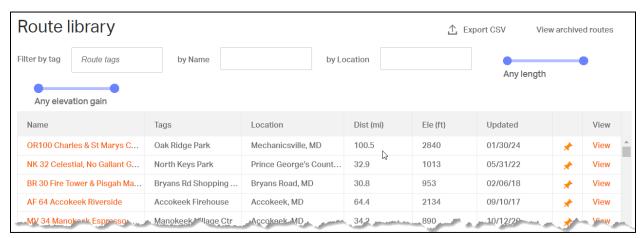


Using the Club Route Library

Once the club's home page is displayed, click **Route Library** from the menu below the photo.

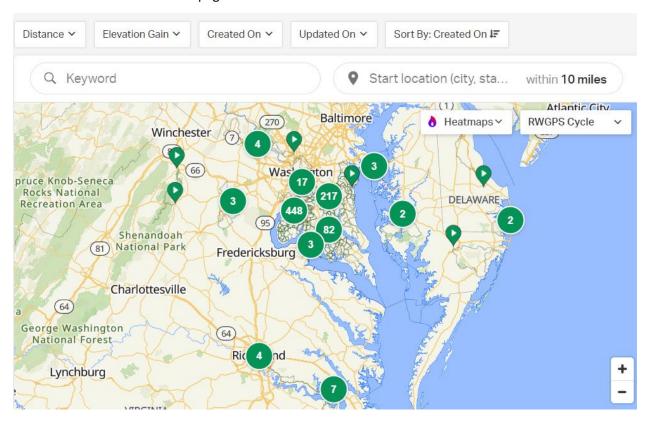


On the Route library page, you can find routes by **ride start** (using the list in *the Filter by Tag* field), by **route name** and by **location**. You can also narrow the list by **ride length** and **elevation gain**. Once you've found a route you can view it by clicking the **View** link.

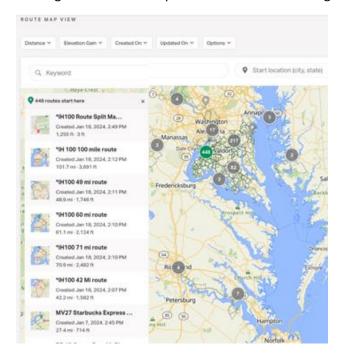

Ride With GPS recently introduced a new way to locate routes, the **Route Map View**, which is also accessible from the club home page.



The number inside each green circle indicates how many routes there are that start in that location. Clicking on the number opens a list of routes starting in the selected location.



Clicking on a route in the list brings up a map of the area with the route you selected highlighted.

You can open the route by clicking on the **View Route** link. You can also search by keyword and location.
